Dear Parents,

We are well into the Spring Term and the children in Beech are really enjoying our work this half term. I hope you all have a fabulous Half Term Break and look forward to the many exciting things planned for the rest of this term.

This term Mrs Tyler continues to teach the class on a Monday and I teach them Tuesday to Friday, supported by Mrs McLeod Monday to Thursday morning and Mrs Baker on a Friday morning. Mrs Presland delivers Art on a Thursday afternoon. Mrs Dean has intervention groups on a Wednesday morning. This term we have a 2nd year, BA Hons student teacher, Miss Carew, working with us until 22/03/24. We also have volunteer assistance from Mr Preston on most Tuesday, Thursday and Friday afternoons.

I would like to thank you for all your hard work at home last term and ask that you continue to hear your child read daily, recording this in their reading record. Although they are all becoming independent readers, it is vital in their progress to continue with this. Please encourage your child to complete 3 mins of tables practice on Times Tables Rockstars (TTR) or Mathsframe at least 4 times per week (or equivalent written practice). This is particularly important for Y4, who will be completing the Statutory Tables assessment in June.

Spellings and tables tests will remain on a Monday morning for this term, so regular practice of the weeks spellings is also encouraged.

We continue to use of Atom Learning for homework. The children have their logins in their reading records. I will be setting either English or Maths weekly as well as optional Science/Verbal/Nonverbal Reasoning. This should help to reinforce their learning within school. I have talked to some parents and removed the timer. However children are not expected to do more than 30 minutes homework. The link to the website is:-

In Maths, we have started with 2D & 3D Shapes and fractions and will be moving on to measuring accurately with a ruler, time and then we will focus on multiplication and division in particular. In English we are looking at Fantasy with 'Leon and the Place Between' by Alison McAllister and Grahame Baker-Smith and traditional tales using 'The Finger Eater' by Dick King-Smith. For
